Lewis Monkeyflower Mimulus lewisii



Description: Clusters of soft, hairy, sticky flower stems grow 8-30 in. tall. Showy, rose-red to pale pink, trumpet-shaped flowers, 1-2 in. long, bloom during the summer. Monkeyflowers have sensitive 2-lobed stamens that close when touched by insects. This may help pollination.

Habitat: Grows along streams and in moist forest openings.

Landscape Uses: Requires wet conditions, preferably by moving water. Adds color. Attracts hummingbirds and butterflies. Spreads by rhizomes.

Other: Botanical specimens were first collected during the Lewis and Clark expedition and the plant was named after Meriwether Lewis
