

Small-flowered Penstemon

Penstemon procerus



Description: Also called littleflower penstemon. Grows 1 ft. tall with tiny, blue-purple, tubular flowers in tight clusters around tips of erect woody stems. Blooms between June and August. Leaves are lance-shaped in a dense clump at the woody base.

Habitat: Dry to moist, well-drained sites, in full sun.

Landscape Uses: Hardy in rocky soil, dry sites, slopes and rock gardens. This perennial works well in xeriscape gardens and is attractive to bees and butterflies. This species can tolerate more acidic soils than most penstemons.
